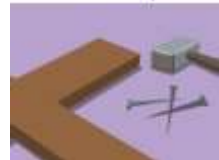

CHANGING FOR A BETTER CHURCH! REALLY?

"We continue to have a deficit year after year. We have budgeted \$5,000.00 per quarter from the trust to use towards our financial obligations, however we have used an additional \$15,000.00 to \$20,000.00 every year from the trust in order to pay all of our bills.

We have cut our budget back as far as we can, and we only have 3.5% of our budget going toward Ministry & Programs (total budget for expenses \$204,874.56; for ministry & programs \$7,300.00)

As a church in recovery, we must use more of our income for programs in our church. If we consider that we are investing ONLY ABOUT 3.5% of our annual income in programs, the days are numbered before we disappear! Then, as your Pastor and leader, I Have To Call You, My Dear Brothers And Sisters, To Consider A Major Intervention. With the slogan "do not sit and wait to die". Our BEUMC is called to be people of faith and work hard knowing that the church will never be rich in finances but very rich in faith, in hopes, generosity, and in love.

What are our weaknesses?:** Mainly our congregation is getting older. The average age is surpassing the times when energies are abundant, and consequently we need new blood; more new young families and new energies. We also need to invest more resources (\$) in providing workers that are absolutely necessary...but we don't have this money" ...**What can we do?"

Here is what my presentation was to the whole church and now, almost three month later I invite you to see what is being answered:

It was already approved by the Church Council and Finance Committees to invest, as a first response, \$20,000 to hire a Music Director (Chancel+Bells+Kids Choir) and a Director Of Children And Family Minis-

tries, both as part-time jobs, beginning 2nd semester in 2017.

I think what we need to do is to work on two areas:

1. Concerning with PROGRAMING: I think **we need urgently, for the next three years** at least, to work intentionally and hard on developing/redeveloping our Congregation. For this purpose, we have been preparing ourselves by doing our previous connections with our community through: Community Dinner, Kids Program, Boy Scouts, Movie Night, Young Adult Encounter, Last Summer's Program, plus a Monthly outside Christian Music Encounter that will be a new plan to reach out to our community! We have to be open for changing ministries and forums. We have to use another strategy in sharing our programs with the community. Our proposed electronic sign, for example, will be a great help. To have, as it was approved, our BMP+Cookie-Walk+Santa Shoppe in one day, which will bring more people for the three activities.

2. Concerning with our FINANCES: We need everyone, all BEUMC members and friends, to remain faithful providing for our financial needs by tithing, contributing, and giving sacrificially if it's necessary. It is difficult to keep diminishing our expenses, but still possible in certain areas to benefit others important for developing, for example, beginning June 2017, we will have a bi-monthly NL, saving yearly more than \$ 2,000, which will be a precious income for programs. Maybe we can find another way to be a church running a more realistic life according with these times, we are not a church with 250 members in attendance, we hope, by God's Grace, we can be there again and we will but we need to work hard, we need to make a bigger effort.

3. We need to be loyal to our BEUMC: This is not the time to go seeking for another church. You are necessary, you are all called to do your effort here and to accomplish your mission at BEUMC. We have to revive our love and care for this congregation. I know that it is easy to leave behind a place where we face challenges and to find a place where you go and sit to listen to a good sermon and go back home. But we have to ask ourselves, is this what Jesus is expecting me to do or am I following my own agenda?

4. We need to love and care for one another: *“People in this congregation need to stop talking bad about one another, or gossiping or eluding their own responsibilities...People need to show Christian love and respect to one another”.* This was a comment that a BEUMC member shared with me, assuming that this is the reason some people are leaving our church.

What can I say? Better to listen to what the Words of God says... *“Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth” (1John 3:18)... “Dear friends, let us love one another, for love come from God” (1 John 4:7)*

We have to continue to welcome everyone, we have to show God’s love for everyone, we have to be careful how we talk and what we talk about, we have to learn and practice the Word of God. Without that, all effort will be a waste of time, money, and energies.

Why does the date for Easter change every year? Have you ever wondered why Easter Sunday can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25? In Western Christianity, Easter is always celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the Paschal Full Moon date of the year. The date of the Paschal Full Moon is determined from historical tables, and has no correspondence to lunar events. In the year 325 AD astronomers approximated the dates of all the full moons in the year for the Western Christian churches. These were called the Ecclesiastical Full Moon dates, and they have been used ever since 326 AD to determine the date of Easter. So, the Paschal Full Moon is always the first Ecclesiastical Full Moon date after March 20 (which happened to be the vernal equinox date in 325 AD). The Paschal Full Moon can vary as much as two days from the date of the actual full moon, with dates ranging from March 21 to April 18. As a result, Easter dates can range from March 22 through April 25 in Western Christianity.
